Spouse/Domestic Partner²	100% of the Employee's Initial Benefit	Coverage is guaranteed provided the employee is actively at work and the spouse/domestic partner is not subject to a medical restriction as set forth on the enrollment form and in the Certificate. ¹
Dependent Child(ren)³	100% of the Employee's Initial Benefit	Coverage is guaranteed provided the employee is actively at work and the dependent is not subject to a medical restriction as set forth on the enrollment form and in the Certificate. ¹

Benefit Payment

Your **Initial Benefit** provides a lump-sum payment upon the first verified diagnosis of a Covered Condition. Your plan pays a one-time Recurrence Benefit per Covered Condition for the following Covered Conditions: Cancer⁴, Heart Attack⁵, Stroke⁶ and Major Organ Transplant⁷. A Recurrence Benefit is only available if an Initial Benefit has been paid for the Covered Condition.⁸

The maximum amount that you can receive through your Critical Illness Insurance plan is called the **Total Benefit** and is 3 times the amount of your Initial Benefit. This means that you can receive multiple Initial Benefit and Recurrence Benefit payments until you reach the maximum of 300% or \$45,000 or \$90,000.

Please refer to the table below for the percentage benefit amount for each Covered Condition.

Example of Initial & Recurrence Benefit Payments

The example below illustrates an employee who elected an Initial Benefit of \$15,000 and has a Total Benefit of 3 times the Initial Benefit Amount or \$45,000.

Illness – Covered Condition	Payment	Total Benefit Remaining
Heart Attack — first verified diagnosis	Initial Benefit payment of \$15,000 or 100%	\$30,000
Heart Attack — second verified diagnosis, two years later	Recurrence Benefit payment of \$15,000 or 100%	\$15,000
Kidney Failure — first verified diagnosis, three years later	Initial Benefit payment of \$15,000 or 100%	\$0

Supplemental Benefits

MetLife provides coverage for the Supplemental Benefits listed below. This coverage does not count towards the Total Benefit Amount payable for the previously mentioned Covered Conditions.

Health Screening Benefit¹⁰

MetLife will provide an annual benefit* of \$50 or \$100 per calendar year for taking one of the eligible screening/prevention measures. MetLife will pay only one health screening benefit per covered person per calendar year.

*The Health Screening Benefit amount depends upon the Initial Benefit Amount selected. Employees would receive a \$50 benefit with the \$15,000 initial benefit amount or a \$100 benefit with the \$30,000 Initial Benefit Amount.

Questions & Answers

Q. Who is eligible to enroll?

A. Regular active full-time employees who are actively at work along with their spouse/domestic partner² and dependent children³ can enroll for MetLife Critical Illness Insurance coverage.¹

Q. How do I pay for coverage?

A. Coverage is paid through payroll deduction.

Q. If I Leave the Company, Can I Keep My Coverage? ¹¹

A. Under certain circumstances, you can take your coverage with you if you leave. You must make a request in writing within a specified period after you leave your employer. You must also continue to pay premiums to keep the coverage in force.

¹ Coverage is guaranteed provided (1) the employee is actively at work and (2) dependents are not subject to medical restrictions as set forth on the enrollment form and in the Certificate. Medical coverage is required to enroll. Additional restrictions apply to dependents serving in the armed forces or living overseas. MetLife will not pay a benefit for a covered cancer that is diagnosed prior to the coverage effective date. Some states require the insured to have medical coverage. Additional restrictions may apply to dependents serving in the armed forces or living overseas.

- 2 Coverage for Domestic Partners, civil union partners and reciprocal beneficiaries varies by state. Please contact MetLife for more information.
- 3 Dependent Child coverage varies by state. Please contact MetLife for more information.
- 4 Please review the Disclosure Statement or Outline of Coverage/Disclosure Document for specific information about cancer benefits. Not all types of cancer are covered. Some cancers are covered at less than the Initial Benefit Amount. Individuals covered under a NY certificate receive a Skin Cancer benefit. For NH residents, there is an initial benefit of \$100 for All Other Cancer.
- 5 The Heart Attack Covered Condition pays a benefit for the occurrence of a myocardial infarction, subject to the terms of the certificate. A myocardial infarction does not include sudden cardiac arrest.
- 6 In certain states, the covered condition is Severe Stroke.
- 7 In some states, we will not pay a Major Organ Transplant benefit if a covered person is placed on the organ transplant list prior to coverage taking effect and subsequently undergoes a transplant procedure for the same organ while coverage is in effect. Covered organs may vary by state; refer to the Certificate for details.
- 8 We will not pay a Recurrence Benefit for a Covered Condition that Recurs during a Benefit Suspension Period. We will not pay a Recurrence Benefit for either a Full Benefit Cancer or a Partial Benefit Cancer unless the Covered Person has not had symptoms of or been treated for the Full Benefit Cancer or Partial Benefit Cancer for which we paid an Initial Benefit during the Treatment Free Period.
- 9 Please review the Outline of Coverage for specific information about Alzheimer's disease.
- 10 The Health Screening Benefit is not available in certain states. In some states, there is a separate mammogram benefit. Please review your Disclosure Statement or Outline of Coverage/Disclosure Document for specific state variations and exclusions around this benefit.
- 11 Eligibility for portability through the Continuation of Insurance with Premium Payment provision may be subject to certain eligibility requirements and limitations. For more information, contact your MetLife representative.
